#### Re: Valley Waste-Resource Management Authority

**MOTION 170406.01** Valley Waste-Resource Management Authority - 2017-18 Operating Budget Deputy Warden Roberts moved, seconded by Councillor Gunn, that Municipal Council approve a 2017-18 operating budget for Valley Waste-Resource Management Authority equal to the amount approved in the 2016-17 budget (\$10,302,256), and that a letter be sent to the Authority advising of this, and that an additional letter follow to outline the concerns on structural and financial matters. Motion carried unanimously.

<u>Re: 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Vimy Ridge</u> – Councillor Morrison recalled, for those present, the First World War commenced in August 1914. The Nova Scotia Highland Brigade consisted of 4 Battalions. By April 9<sup>th</sup>, 1917, the 85<sup>th</sup> Battalion was all that was left of the four, and was sent on Easter Sunday to secure a prominent feature - at Vimy Ridge. At wars end, the 85<sup>th</sup> Battalion was renamed the Cape Breton Highlanders, who's Gaelic motto was 'a breed of manly men'. Vimy infused into Canada something that said 'we have done something significant'. It marks a time when Canada became more of a country than a colony. Vimy has received a lot of publicity, but is not a celebration of war; it is a tribute to those 60,000 people who volunteered to serve in the Canadian Army, and who paid the ultimate sacrifice.
