Re: Bridgetown 2019-LUB-003 Schell LUB Zoning Map Amendment Application

A Dunphy circulated a revised sketch which recognizes the recommendations of BAAC and PAC showing the 50 foot change. PAC made a recommendation, which was also circulated to desks.

• Bridgetown 2019-LUB-003 Schell LUB Zoning Map Amendment Application

In accordance with the recommendation of the Planning Advisory Committee, Councillor Heming moved, seconded by Councillor Gunn, following the full consideration of the related goals, objectives and policies of the Bridgetown Municipal Planning Strategy, that Municipal Council give first reading of its intent to amend the Bridgetown Land Use Bylaw (LUB) Zoning Map to rezone that portion of the Stephen and Carrie Schell property (PID No. 05150610) commencing fifty feet (50 ft.) south of the existing residential dwelling (98 Granville St) and running to the Conservation (02) Zone, from the Residential Light Density (R-1) to the Institutional (I-1) to permit the redevelopment of that portion of the property as a Women's Mental Health and Alcohol Treatment Centre.

It was moved by Councillor Morrison, seconded by Councillor McNeil, to amend the motion by inserting at the end 'pending consideration of a traffic study'. Motion carried unanimously.

The Planner added a cautionary note – if a Public Hearing has not been held within 120 days from receipt of the application, the application has been deemed to be refused. From the time council initially accepted the application (submitted on December 2, 2019). This motion is delaying the decision.

Councillor Morrison moved, seconded by Deputy Warden Roberts, to defer the recommended action to February Committee of the Whole pending receipt of further information. Motion carried unanimously.

MOTION 200128.02 Schell Amendment Application - Request Additional Information It was moved by Councillor Fowler, seconded by Deputy Warden Roberts, that the applicant provide for February Committee of the Whole: a traffic study for the property; site plan to scale; and photos and/or brochures for the tents, digitally if possible. Motion carried unanimously.
